His review was a deal more accurate and objective than many I have read. He was fair and balanced. Interestingly he did not appreciate bad language in scripts and is not alone among reviewers. Is this a feature of scripts these days or simply a characteristic of the people reviewing them? Arguably a significant smattering of bad language is needed in modern scripts to lend them a degree of authenticity and an objective reviewer can see past such nuances. That's enough editorialising for one month!!

Arctic Fevers, The Madcap Adventures of Captain Edmonsons and Trusty Manservant Fife, has done extremely well at the OAP festivals in Emerald and Macedon. Jon Itialiano has won a Best Supporting Actor, Tony a Best Actor and Alan Best Director. It has won a Best Comedy and Runner up best Production award.

Congratulations to Alan, Tony, Jon and Eloise for bringing it alive and, belatedly, we need to thank Theatre 451, our friends in Hurstbridge, for passing on the script and to the author Seaton Kay-Smith for the rights to perform.
